Valerie was the first girl and third child of nine born to Mrs. Tucker. She received her early education in Prince George County, VA. After graduation from high school, She attended Virginia State University. Upon the urging of her big brother (Junie), Val moved to the big city of Baltimore, to be with him in August of 1977. They shared a very tight and loving relationship. Val was first dedicated to Christ as a youth at Harrison Grove Baptist Church (Prince George, VA.) and later became a member of Israel Baptist Church in 1990 under the leadership of H. Walden Wilson, II. She was an active member of the ministry until her illness prevented her from attending her first Master Life Class. Val ended her 16-year career with Johns Hopkins Hospital in 2005, after which she went out on disability. Even though Val was plagued with various illnesses and in pain, she demonstrated much strength and endurance through it all. Being the matriarch of the Tucker family, Val shared a different bond with her mom, each sibling, niece and nephew. Any and everyone who came in contact with Val all shared the same sentiment, "what a nice, bubbly, generous person." Everyone should have a mother, daughter, sister aunt, cousin, and a friend like Val. She leaves to mourn; her mother, Gertrude V. her brothers, Walter B. (Junie), Joaquin (Jock), Ronald (Bernard), Torsten (Kenny), Auguston (Gus), Stephen (Mony), Christopher (Christ); and her only sister, Teresa; a host of cousins, nieces and nephews.
