Valerie was known for her high energy, loud talking, party-ready demeanor but even more for her warm spirit and welcoming heart. She had an unforgettable presence, greeting everyone with her famous gold tooth smile. Valerie welcomed everyone into her home, which was often filled with children (nieces, nephews and friends of her children) and she would never let anyone leave hungry. She always offered something to eat from beer chicken or rice pudding to a simple sandwich and/or a glass of her famously sweet “diabetic Kool-Aid”. She loved celebrating life, dancing, hanging with her kids (when her sons weren’t trying to be her dads) and enjoying good times with family and friends. To know Valerie was truly to love her and to be loved by her.

In 1993, Valerie was blessed with her first grandchild, and over the next two decades, her family grew to include seven grandchildren: six boys and one girl. They spent many weekends with her, along with a few great nieces and nephews. Those weekends consisted of wrestling matches, water fights, movie nights, pizza parties and somehow packing at least six kids along with herself into one queen size bed which has always been a family mystery.

In 2024, Valerie decided to reconnect with Christ and joined Raising Zion Baptist Church. Where she attended faithfully and consistently every Sunday.
