January 26, 1943 - February 21, 2012

After a brief illness, Vera Ann Grant went to be with the Lord on Tuesday February 21, 2012 at the Long Island College Hospital in Brooklyn, NY.

"Vera" (affectionately called Vee or Aunt Vee by her family and friends) was born in Patterson, Georgia on January 26, 1943. She was preceded in death by her mother and father Viola Dawson and Elijah Hamm. Vee began her education in the Pierce County, Georgia Public School system. At the age of 8, along with her grandparents that raised her, Vee moved to Richmond, VA where she continued her education.
