Vernell Eaton-Harper was born on May 28, 1936 in South Boston, VA. to the late Willie and Hallie Wilson. Throughout her life, Vernell was known to be a loving, gentle spirited, Godly woman. She received her education from Halifax County School System. During the 1950's she moved to Richmond under the care and guidance of the late Evangelist Sue I. Edwards of The Apostolic Faith Holiness Church, where she was baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. She was later ordained by Mother Sue as a Missionary. While faithfully attending church, Mother Sue introduced Vernell to Elvin Eaton. In 1955, they married and from their union they had six beautiful children.

Over the years, Vernell loved telling people about the goodness of the Lord and Salvation. Her first priority was family and church. Vernell also enjoyed in her leisure time planting flowers, decorating her home and caring for those in need. In 1980, she moved to Baltimore, MD. For over 33 years, Vernell devoted her life caring for the elderly and became an entrepreneur. She opened a section of her home for the elderly until she retired. 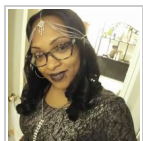
