



## Vernon S. Nelson

June 27, 1958 - September 28, 2013

Vernon S. Nelson, son of Randolph P. Nelson, Jr. and the late Lillian E. Nelson was born on June 27, 1958.

On the evening of September 28, 2013, after a short battle with a terminal illness, God called his son Vernon S. Nelson home.

Vernon grew up in a tight-knit family in Edmondson Village. He attended Baltimore City Public Schools, and graduated from Edmondson High School in 1976. He also attended Community College of Baltimore for two years. Shortly after graduating from Edmondson High School, Vernon followed in his brothers' footsteps and began his career at the Prime Rib Restaurant. He progressed from bus-boy to chef. Vernon was a very proud employee, and served loyally for 38 years.
