Virginia Chavis, our beloved sister, aunt, cousin and friend, left her earthly vessel to transition to her spiritual reward on Thursday, December 31, 2020. She was 77 years old.

Virginia born on September 30, 1943 in Baltimore, Maryland, the middle child of the late Derrill and Eular (Holmes) Chavis, Ginny, as she was fondly called by all of her friends and family, was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. She graduated from Dunbar High School in 1961. Ginny found employment at the Department of Defense, Fort Meade, Maryland as a Personnel Security Specialist and retired after 36 years of dedicated service.

Ginny joined Eastern Methodist Church on March 25, 1957, under the pastorate of the late Rev. Calvin P. Crosson. She remained an active member until God called her home, serving in various leadership roles, such as Church School Secretary, Church Secretary, Church Membership Chair, Worship Chair, and a Prayer Warrior, just to name a few. For over 30 years, Ginny held the distinct title of "Church Announcer" reading the church announcements most Sundays and when requested for other special services. Although Ginny did not have any biological children, she was a mother to many Eastern and Community children.

Ginny enjoyed shopping and traveling with her family. She was an excellent

cook making broccoli cornbread, ambrosia, apple pies, and sweet potato pies. Her favorite foods were fried chicken, steamed fish, burned hot dogs, and sea food that she was not supposed to eat. Ginny was an active member of the Govans Red Hatters Chapter for many years.
