Her brief time at Courtland Gardens Nursing Home she became known as Nurse Virginia (wearing her scrubs). Before she left in July of 2010, she found herself helping out those less fortunate than herself. Even when she returned back to her apartment she ran errands for her neighbors. Virginia was a fighter. She did not allow her illness to keep her down, nor hinder her. She continued to press on in spite of her condition. To know her was to truly love her.
