VIRGINIA ELIZABETH PEACE, daughter of the late Bennie Lee and Pearl A. Brown, was born on August 9, 1938, in Baltimore, Maryland. Virginia was educated in the Baltimore City Public Schools where she pursued a curriculum in Elementary Education. She was employed by the Baltimore Public School System at Fort Worthington Elementary School, Lake Clifton High School and Montebello Elementary School. She also served in a clerical position for the Urban Services Agency. Virginia attended Knox Presbyterian Church since she was an infant. She became an official member at the age of 12 after completing Pastor's class. Over the years, Virginia served on the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Choirs; as a Sunday School Teacher for the Senior Class; was a member of the Board of Christian Education, Summer Camp Committee, and Deacon Board; as well as other committees of the church. In 1956, Virginia was joined in holy matrimony to the late Edward J. Peace. From this union three daughters were born: Balinda, Yolanda and Volanda. Virginia loved to read and write poetry and was the author of two published books and many poems. She loved writing personal poems for friends and family and making plaques for those she knew, as well as upon special request. Virginia also loved to read and discuss the Bible. Her favorite scripture was Psalm 119:105, "The Lord is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path." After a lengthy illness, God's angels escorted her home on February 16, 2010. Virginia was a good Christian and loving wife, mother, grandmother and sister who leaves a legacy of love to her family and friends.
