Virginia was educated at Bryce School in Manchester, Jamaica. In the early 1930's she was united in holy matrimony to Leslie Green. To this union were born three daughters and one son Amanda, Avis, Miley and Ralph. They later moved to St. Thomas, Jamaica, where they lived with their children. Several years later another daughter, Mildred, and a son, KenRoy were born. She was a devoted mother and wife. She later relocated from St. Thomas to Kingston, Jamaica where she resided for many years. In 1977, Virginia migrated to Baltimore, Maryland to join her children and grandchildren. She gave unselfishly to her family and friends. The word "no" was never a part of her vocabulary. Virginia became a United States citizen on September 12, 1996. Through the years, Virginia acquired many names of endearment, in addition to Mum, including Aunt Virgie, because of her Maroon African Tribe Heritage, the name Nana was given to her by her mother. She fancied scarves with bright, vibrant colors to adorn her hair. Virginia was a woman of strong religious convictions.
