Her siblings Herman, Cornelius, Clinton, James, Raymon, Robert, Carrie Gold Jackson and Ella Walker preceded her in death.

A Time to Plant

Virginia attended the Prince Edward County Schools. She had a thirst for learning and was a great encourager for continuing ones education. She attended the Paul Lawrence Dunbar High School, Baltimore, MD in preparation of preparing to obtain her GED. She had a great work ethic and took pride in whatever job she had. She retired from Sinai Hospital, Baltimore, MD, but continued to work in a private home following her retirement. She was easy to spend time with and had a pleasant demeanor. She was not one to criticize; instead she would take the high side and find a positive way of thinking about the situation.

A Time to Embrace

Virginia accepted Christ at an early age. She was baptized at the Levi Baptist Church, Green Bay, VA. She later joined the Victory Prayer Chapel, Baltimore, MD, where she was a very active member for over 20 years. She served as

an Usher and was an Intercessory Prayer Warrior. She was a faithful member and was always willing to give an encouraging word based on biblical principle. When her health declined she was unable to attend and be in worship service with her church family. Virginia loved her church and was excited to engage in conversation about her Savior.

A Time to Love

Virginia married John E. Paige on July 19, 1946 in Green Bay, VA and moved to Day Village in Turners Station, MD. To this union three sons were born. Virginia and her family later moved to Baltimore City, MD. She was a devoted wife and loving mother. She was relentless in working with her challenged son Ernest, to ensure that he be as independent as possible. Her husband John and her son, John, Jr. preceded her in death.

A Time to Break Down

In true fashion as a Jackson, Virginia had a strong will to do all she could for herself even in light of her diminished capabilities due to her declining health. She spent her last year in an Assisted Living Home where she loved and appreciated the loving care she received.
