VIRGINIA B. WHITE, the daughter of the late Willie and Star Brown, was born on October 5, 1923 in Hertford County, North Carolina. After many years of residing at The Clem and Doll Assistant Living Facility, she departed this life on May 19, 2009 following a short stay at Seasons Hospice. Early in her youth, Virginia was baptized in Christ and accepted the Lord as her personal Savior while still living in North Carolina. Pursuing her dreams and aspirations, she moved to Baltimore, Maryland moving her membership to Shiloh Baptist Church. Joining St Matthew's Episcopal Church with her husband, Virginia was later baptized and confirmed. She remained a faithful parishioner and avid member of the altar guild while St. Matthew's Episcopal Church transitioned to The Episcopal Church of The Holy Covenant. Virginia graduated from Winton High School in North Carolina. After moving to Baltimore, Maryland, she received her certification from The Strayer Business School of Baltimore City. Her education allowed her to obtain a position with the Glen L. Martin Company as a civilian for the Army Signal Corps. Here, she met her future husband, Leroy. In 1955, she was wed in holy matrimony to the late Leroy S. White. From this union, they were blessed with one child. Virginia was a kind and loving person, opening her heart and home to those who were less fortunate. She became a foster parent caring for children who were not her own. A creator of "unique cuisine" and a masterful seamstress, she fed and clothed the young. She cooked many meals for the elderly who were unable to care for themselves in addition to providing for her family. Virginia
