June 3, 1929 - November 26, 2004

On Friday, November 26, 2004 at 7:51 a.m., God dispatched his angels to Henrico Doctors Hospital to take Walter home. Walter "Speed" Williams Jr. was born on June 3, 1929 in Trenton, New Jersey to the late Walter and Catherine Wykoff Williams. Walter attended New Jersey schools until joining the U.S. Armed Forces in 1951. He was honorably discharged on September 1, 1959 with three Service Medals: Korean Service, W/3 Bronze Service Star, and the United Nations Service Medal. Walter relocated to Queens, New York and married Ojetta Moorer in 1955 and to this union five children were born. Valerie (deceased), Walter Jr., Blanche (deceased); Stephanie (deceased), and Gregg. Walter became Roman Catholic in 1961 and was dedicated to his faith. He retired from the Department of Sanitation for the city of New York where he had served over 20 years. After Walter's wife died in 1989, in the early 90's he moved to Richmond, Virginia where he resided until his death. Walter's greatest joy was playing cards and board games with his family and friends on the weekends. He loved staying home to entertain people and being with his family.
