WEALTHY ROSE MONTAGUE was born on March 28, 1920 in Amelia County, Virginia, the daughter of the late Eddie and Isabella Goodman. She departed this life on Thursday, October 16, 2003. She received her education in Amelia, Virginia graduating from High School. When moving to Baltimore, she furthered her education by attending Johns Hopkins School of Cosmetology. Years later she became employed with the Baltimore City Public School System working first at Edmondson High School and then at Thomas Jefferson Elementary School where she was manager of the cafeteria. After many years of service, she retired June 1983. On May 23, 1942, she was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Raymond G. Montague. This union was blessed with three children, one son Edward Barrie Montague, who preceded her in death (Dec. 20, 1987) and two daughters. She will be remembered as a devoted wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother, who received great pleasure from spending countless hours with her family. Wealthy, or "Rose" as she was fondly known to her family and friends, loved cooking hot buttered rolls and fried chicken on Sundays after worshiping in the house of the Lord. One of her favorite pastimes was watching the soap opera "General Hospital" and family and friends knew not to interrupt her during that time. Rose accepted Christ at an early age and worshiped with her family at Little Union Baptist Church in Amelia, Virginia, where she was taught to believe in and always trust in God. After moving to Baltimore, she joined Perkins Square Baptist Church in 1963 under the late Rev. Ward Yerby. She
