



Wendell Lucius Walker

June 13, 1944 - March 18, 2015

Wendell Lucius Walker, son of the late Ernest and Lucy Walker, was born June 13, 1944 in Roanoke, VA. After a brief illness, he departed this life on March 18, 2015. He joined Mt. Ararat Baptist Church in 1979, where he was a devoted member. He received his education at Carver and Roanoke County Training School. After serving in the US Army he came to Baltimore with \$5 and a plan. Walker, as many of his friends called him had many accomplishments, including teaching martial arts and dancing, real estate investment, publishing two books, writing and playing music and he played in a band for many years. His major accomplishment was "Walker's Home Improvement" which was established in 1966. He was known as "The Man with the Hammer". Another source of pride for Walker is "It's Unbelievable," a Social venue where one could enjoy, dancing, recreational activities, fitness and health, and a holiistic day spa.

After the passing of his first wife, Walker became a single parent to his only child Dale and his first wife's children. But in 1970, he met his soul-mate, Cecilia and they married in 1980. He was one of seventeen children and his surviving siblings are Flora Smith, Leslie "Dot" Walker Elgene Cherriez, Mary Anne Walker, Elaine Walker, Norman Walker, Milan "Mink" Walker and Bernard Walker.

Walker was a man of God whose favorite saying was "God first, family

second." He enjoyed family time, cooking, entertaining, story- telling and especially his home improvement work. He also loved to help, mentor and inspire everyone he came in contact with. Although he inspired others, he was inspired by his math teacher, Mts. Georgia Reeves, who he called 'Mom."

Walker is survived by his devoted wife, Cecilia, four children: Dale "Pooh" Walker (TK "Sunshine"Washington), Marquita Walker (Shawn Yarberough), LaVerne Aston and Antionette McAillster (James McAllister); eight grandchildren: David, Terrance, Edward, Diamond, Morgan, Ziamir, Savior, Samyia; one great-grand-child, Chloe; a HOST of nieces, nephews, relatives, friends and a special friend and partner, Bo Jackson.
