WILBURT MAURICE CHAMBERS; born December 15, 1949, son of the late Catherine Sturdivant Reid and Melvin Gilmore was called home to glory on September 24, 2012 at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland at the age of 62. He is predeceased by his wife, Vaile Margarita Chambers (September 15, 2012).

Wilbert received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System, and in 1969 graduated from the School of Merchant Seaman where he traveled the world for eight years.
