Wilbert was known for his solo, "God Specializes" and his duet with his wife, "May the Work I've Done Speak for Me." Their songs were loved every time they performed. God called Wilbert to serve under Reverend Andre Briscoe at the St. Matthew's New Life United Methodist Church, where he served until his passing.

Wilbert was a faithful servant of God and made sure he was on the Glory Train line every Monday and Wednesday with his daughter Leah, and his Brotherhood meeting every other Tuesday, both under the direction of Elder Sherman.
