



## Wilbur Jeffers Keeton Jr.

Wilbur J. Keeton, Jr., son of the late Wilbur J. Sr. and Mary H. Keeton, was born on October 30, 1951 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on Tuesday, July 24, 2012.

He graduated from Baltimore City College in 1971 and attended Coppin State College and Bowie State from 1972 to 1974. He was an avid sports fan and athlete; playing basketball, baseball, soccer and football.

Wilbur began working at NSA, National Security Agency, in 1978 and was employed with them for twenty-one years. During that time he held many positions including Arbitrator for Employment Concerns and Protective Agent. He also had a part-time job at Shaw Bus Company with his father. In 2001, Wilbur joined the Department of General Services and was there for over ten years.

He began his Christian walk as a young boy at Central Baptist Church and also fellowshiped at Doswell Cathedral COGIC, Greater Hope COGIC and (more recently) Highway Christian Church.
