William Arthur Hunt, the son of Forrest Hunt and Beulah Turner, was born on November 30, 1909 in Greenville, South Carolina. William and his sister Rosie Mae spent their formative years in the union of Beulah and Solomon Hines. Many of the values that William held dear and important were developed in the relationship with his stepfather, Solomon Hines. As a student, he often demonstrated an outstanding memory and ability to recite poetry. William, also affectionately known as Bill, the valedictorian of his junior high school class, completed his formal education at Douglass High School. William remained an eager student all his life, completing a vocational training program in order to gain job advancement. William's union with Bernice Koon would produce one son, William Andsworth, and his union with Janie Yarbrough produced one son, Roland Arthur. He was proud of both sons throughout his life. Bill's work history includes tenure at Bethlehem Steel Corporation and forty-two years with the United States Postal Service. Work at the Post Office became his passion and defined his life. During his career, he rose from clerk through supervisory and management positions, retiring from the position of Superintendent of the Truck Terminal at the Post Office. Had he been of another generation and worked for meritocracy, he would have become Postmaster General. William had many interests including religious, social, civic, and political and in self-improvement activities. He was a devoted and an active member of Faith Baptist Church and served as a trustee until his health and advancing years forced him to curtail active service. However, he

continued to study the Bible. Bill was a member of Mr. Sinai Lodge #63 for over thirty years. He was a leader and served as president of The New Northwood Community Association and the Dallas Pleasure Club as president for many years. William was an avid reader who continually worked to improve his vocabulary skills. He had a special knack for telling stories and jokes that made him a hit at formal and informal gatherings.
