On February 28, 2010, WILLIAM (BILLY) RAY BRIDGES (CPA), son of Lois Bridges and the late Clyde Bridges, made his transition to a better home. Billy was born on July 3, 1941 in Pageland, Chesterfield County, South Carolina. He spent his early childhood in Kannapolis, North Carolina. The family moved to Baltimore, Maryland in 1955. Billy attended Sollers Point High School in Dundalk, Maryland. The family later moved to Baltimore City. Billy received his G.E.D. From Community College of Baltimore. He later received his Associate's Degree in Accounting from the Community College of Baltimore. Billy went on to receive his BS degree in Accounting from the University of Baltimore. Billy obtained his license as a certified public accountant (CPA) in 1988. He worked for more than thirteen years as an auditor for the State of Maryland's Insurance Commission. He also worked numerous jobs in the state to include positions at the U.S. Coast Guard, Continental Can Co., ARMCO Steel Co., the American Can Co. and the American Standard Co. Billy especially loved to attend church, and he attended church regularly until his illness. He also loved to fish and to travel. He was a member of Mount Calvary Star Baptist Church, where he served as a deacon for many years. He later joined the Bethel A.M.E. Church under the leadership of Bishop John R. Bryant and finally joined the Empowerment Temple in 2001, as the church was organizing. He married Edwina Grant in 1967, and there were no children of this union. He leaves to mourn: his surviving spouse-wife, Edwina Bridges; his mother, Lois Bridges of Baltimore, Md.; two brothers, Harry of Baltimore,

Md. And Charles Sr. of Mount Jay, Pa.; and a nephew and niece, Charles Jr. and Alicia Bridges of Laurel, Md.
