On March 25, 1933, William Henry Carter was born in Baltimore, Maryland, to the late

Alexander and Curlene Carter. On April 29, 2024, God called him home.

As many of his friends and family called him, Blinky graduated from Frederick Douglass High

School with a high school diploma. Then, on July 18, 1952, he enlisted in the Air Force Reserve

to work as a Communication Center Specialist. Before being removed from active duty on July

17, 1956, he served for four years. The National Defense Service Medal, the Good Conduct

Medal, and the Occupational Medal (Germany) were awarded to him upon his release. He

started working at Fort Meade in the communication field after leaving the Air Force.

Before leaving Fort Meade after 42 years of service in his last position as Chief of Operation

Systems Integration Division, he held a number of positions in the communications department.

He was in charge of the Information Center, the communications division, the data processing

facility, and the application and development of systems as the chief of OSID.

His broad smile—the kind that could brighten any space—will always be the feature that most

people remember about him. Everyone who knew him knew he was a style icon; he always

dressed nicely, and Jos A Banks was his favorite store to shop.
