July 11, 1916 - September 8, 2008

WILLIAM DANTZLER, beloved husband of Mary Dantzler and son of Whitfield and Alice Dantzler, was July 11th, 1916 and departed his earthly home on September 8th, 2008, to be with his heavenly Father, at the age of ninety – two. Bill (as he was known to his family and friends) was raised in Orangeburg County, South Carolina, the third of eight Dantzler children. He received his early education at Preston Elementary School in Orangeburg, SC. In his early adult life in Orangeburg County, Bill worked on a farm and later in a saw mill. To improve his employment opportunities Bill moved to Baltimore, Maryland in 1937. A respectful and religious person he joined The Grace Memorial Church within a year or two after coming to Baltimore. He was a proud member of The Grace Memorial Church in Baltimore, Maryland until the day he died. After finding steady employment William was drafted into the U.S. Army and served during the Word War II years of 1942 and 1946. He was promoted to the rank of Corporal and received an honorable discharge. A year after his discharge from the military he married the love of his life Mary Stallings of Elizabeth City, North Carolina in 1946. Bill and Mary were married for sixty-two years. When asked for the successful formula for their marriage he would say, “I just listen when she talks. For thirty-seven years Bill worked for Terminal Services Company as a warehouse clerk laying the foundation for a meaningful retirement. Bill leaves to mourn: his wife, Mary Dantzler; two brothers, John and Peter; one sister, Alice Zeigler, all of Orangeburg, South Carolina; and a host of cousins, nephews, nieces and friends.
