William Adrian Green, affectionately known as Butch, son of the late William and Ernestine Green, was born on September 23, 1952 in Baltimore, Maryland. After a lengthy illness, the Lord called him home to glory after being showered with love on Thursday, August 31, 2017

Butch was reared in a Christian home. He accepted Christ at an early age under the spiritual leadership of Bishop Clifford M. Johnson at Mt Pleasant Church and Ministries.

He received his education in Baltimore City Public Schools, where he graduated with honors from Baltimore City College in 1970. Butch was an avid sports fan. One of his favorite past times was spending time with his daughter Tierra and his nephew Mario, watching the Ravens. The highlight of his life was his grandchildren and there was nothing he wouldn't do for them. He always enjoyed family game nights on the weekends.
