April 25, 1911 - December 14, 2003

William Henry Waddy Sr. was born on April 25, 1911 in Orange County, Virginia. "Daddy," as he was so affectionately called by his family, departed this life December 14, 2003 when God gently spoke to him and called him home. Daddy was baptized at a very early age, and as young man moved to Baltimore, Maryland. In 1932, he joined New Shiloh Baptist Church. He loved the Lord and his church family, and was an active member of the Male Usher Board, a Trustee, and part-time custodian. He was a Christian who served Christ with great joy and humility. On November 21, 1936 he was joined in holy wedlock to Ophelia Christine Boddie, who preceded him in death. Out of this union five children were born. "Big Bill," as his wife lovingly called him was a very hardworking, warmhearted, and sensitive husband and father. He always showed concern for his family, neighbors and friends. Whenever you needed help you could depend on him; whether it was hanging a curtain, or replacing a battery in your car, Big Bill would travel to help you no matter how far. William served in the United States Army Air Corp from March 1943 to April 1946 and received an honorable discharge. After his discharge from the military he attended radio and TV electronic, and welding schools. He then was employed by Bethlehem Steel Company and after 28 years of employment retired in 1976. To cherish his memory Daddy leaves his five children, Gloria Y. Harris, William H. Waddy Jr., Diane Godbolt, Malcolm Waddy, and L. Marlin Gibbs; seventeen grandchildren, twenty-five great grandchildren, four great-great grandchildren; two daughters-in-law; two sons-

in-law; two sisters-in-law; and one brother-in-law; a host of nieces and nephews, and other relatives and friends.
