



## William Winder Johnson, Sr.

December 13, 1924 - October 24, 2011

William "Winder" Johnson, Sr. was born on December 13, 1924, to the late William Miles and Lillie Mae Johnson in Hanover County, Va. He was educated in the Hanover County School System before enlisting in the United States Navy.

William married Beulah B. Mines, of Doswell, Va., in August 1948. God blessed their union with three devoted children. Skilled as a carpenter, butcher and meat journeyman, William worked hard to ensure provision for his family. Having worked at Kingham's, Richfood, Hygrade, Todd Hams and Giant Foods, William retired from J.P. Taylor in 1986.

Joining at an early age, it was at Bethany Baptist Church in Montpelier, Virginia where William accepted Christ as his Savior. There he was baptized, sang in the choir and began his lifelong service to the Lord. In the 1960s William established his family's home in the Battery Park neighborhood of Richmond. He began attending services and serving the Lord, at First African Baptist Church. In 1977, he officially moved his membership to First African and continued to serve faithfully, until his health no longer allowed him to do so.
