### Biography of William Ofori Attah

For high school, he graduated from Salem Secondary School, also in Accra.

He subsequently followed his passion in artistry to pursue training in graphic arts at the Opportunities industrialization Center of Accra (O.J.C). Following his completion of this training, he worked as a private consultant until 1992 when he traveled to the United States.

Upon arrival in the United States, Ofori settled in Richmond, Virginia but moved to New York City a few years later. Still following his passion and the dreams for which he migrated to the United States, Ofori relocated from New York to Worcester, Massachusetts where he believed he had opportunities for more success. However, driven by his love for family, he ultimately decided to return to Richmond to join his sister and the rest of her family.

Ofori was a dedicated Christian; he lived his life as an Adventist. In New York, he worshipped with Bronx's First Ghana Seventh Day Adventist Church. In Massachusetts, he worshipped at the New England Ghanaian Seventh Day Adventist Church. When he returned to Richmond, he continued his faith as an active church member at the Richmond Ephesus Seventh Day Adventist Church. For work, he supported his family at the Goodness and Mercy African Market. Ofori touched many hearts with his kindness and humility. He was very active on social media where he was followed by many friends and admirers. His death would come as a shock to many who have still not heard of his demise. He will be missed by many, and we know the Good Lord will reserve a good place in paradise for his precious soul till we see him again on the resurrection day.
