William H. Roberts, Jr., son of Marjorie Roberts-Hill and the late William H. Roberts, Sr., was born on May 28th, 1949 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on January 16th, 2020 after a lengthy illness.

Bill received his formal education from Baltimore City Public Schools. He attended Western Maryland College and University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC). He received his Master's degree at the Pacific College of Oriental Medicine in New York City and his Master's of Technology from Chesapeake Bible College and Seminary. Bill also was a certified Master Gardener.

In 1970, Bill met and married Sheariah Parker and from this union came his three sons William III, Tuwan, and Aaron Roberts. He later married Brenda Taylor and from this union came Nicole Vernee Roberts. Then in 1995, he married the love of his life, Janice Thompson.

Bill's employment covered many fields but he was a born salesman. He leased cars, sold insurance, and sold moving packages. Bill was also a talented professor, teaching meditation classes at Baltimore-area community colleges and bible study at Chesapeake Bible College and Seminary. Bill also owned a sporting goods business called "Protech" for more than fifteen years. He recently began a new business venture called "NuGreen", which will

continue to focus on the development of essential oils and tinctures for better health.

Bill was passionate about gardening and supporting his church. He worked tirelessly to start Deborah's Garden at New Creation Christian Church, where he was also a Deacon. Bill was deeply committed to providing fresh fruits and vegetables to the church and community. When growing fruits and vegetables during spring and summer was not enough, he solicited the help of a dear friend to sponsor the purchase of a hoop house so that the garden would flourish year round. He then secured a \$100,000 grant to add a meditation garden to the grounds of the church.

Bill had a very giving heart and loved to serve his community and those in need. He was a chaplain at Frederick Memorial Hospital and was very active in urban farming throughout the Baltimore City area.
