On the evening of Wednesday, November 20, 2019, God opened the gates of heaven to welcome home Willie Lee Wingo-Andrews, ending her Christian journey of 85 years.

Willie was born on November 11, 1934 to the late Mary and Mack Burnett, in Alberta, Virginia. She was the third of eight children. She was preceded in death by her siblings Carrie, JoAnna, Hazel and John.

Willie married her first husband, Herbert Hundley Wingo, on October 6, 1955. They were married for sixteen years and had two children, Andrea and Darryl. Willie was a homemaker until her husband passed in 1971. Shortly after, Willie began working for the phone company as a part-time phone operator to support her young children. After approximately twenty years Willie retired.

Willie married her second husband, Dewey Andrews, Jr., on August 16, 1979. They were married for thirty-three years before Dewey's passing in 2012.

At a young age, Willie devoted her life to Christ and was a faithful servant throughout the years. She was a member of the First Bible Church of the Lord's Mission, Bronx, NY; and continued serving Christ at Antioch Christian Center, International, Richmond, VA.

Willie was a deeply religious woman who will be missed dearly by those who knew and loved her. Willie was a constant source of positivity as a loving wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend; she devoted her life to her family, and would go above and beyond to help those in need.
