they joined the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church under the pastorate of the Reverend H. J. Tunson. Many years later, while living at his rehabilitation housing, The Greenhouse, Willie James heard the Gospel preached on his floor. It was later known that those in attendance received Christ as Lord and Savior.

A Time with Family

As the elder child, he was close to his family. After the transition of both parents, his sister Betty took him and his brother Thomas, to live with her. In the year 2015 with the help of his niece Renay, both Willie James and Thomas moved together to The Endor Apartments at Stadium Place on East 33rd Street. Upon his illness, he moved to the Stadium Place Nursing and Rehabilitation better known as the Greenhouse.

A Time to Love and Recreation

Willie James was not married or had children, but he loved to watch Westerns, Pro Wrestling, Orioles/Ravens games on television, and listen to the Motown sounds of Marvin Gaye singing, 'What's Going On.' He was a foodie. With fork and knife in hand, he loved breakfast, lunch, snacks, and dinner.

A Time to Transition

Willie James Brice was called Home to be with the Lord on Monday morning, July 15, 2024, at the Greenhouse at Stadium Place.
