The marriage ended in divorce, but did not diminish the love shared for the family; they raised their children well. He served as a member of the Church-wide Sick Committee and was a dedicated Trustee Emeritus. He loved the Fountain Baptist Church family and through his illness, their prayers, visits, cards, gifts, phone calls, and love were a source of great joy to him. Willie had a zest for life and made friends everywhere he went. His sense of humor shined through as he became confined to a wheelchair. He smiled and found new friends among the nurses, staff, and residents at Fairland Nursing and Rehab in Silver Spring, Md. Last February, he was voted as "King of Valentine's Day." Willie became an avid HO train collector, after receiving a set as a treasured gift from his sister Daisy. He enjoyed music and recently had been listening to oldies but goodies from Sarah Vaughn, the Orioles, Dionne Warwick, and Dinah Washington. One of

Willie's favorite songs was "One in a Million," by Larry Graham. That could be said about him.
