Mom had many nicknames "Frau," Ms. Pat, but Mom-Mom was her favorite. Along with her husband she loved to entertain family and friends at her Braddish Ave. home. She could put together a feast in matter of minutes. Her famous corn pudding recipe is still in the family. Mom loved to travel, and cover North America from Canada to Mexico, Martha's Vineyard to Florida, California and many places in between as well as cruises to Bermuda, Bahamas, and Jamaica. In 1959 along with her two daughters she joined Mt. Ararat Baptist Church and was baptized by the late Pastor Samuel B. Redd. As she began her Christian journey she joined the Willing Workers. Under the leadership of Rev. Charles E. Coger. She became a member of several ministries, Female Ushers, Outreach Ministry, and the Triple "L" Ministry. Pastor Coger appointed her to head up the Outreach Ministry, which was a labor of love for her, and got her whole family involved. In 1990 after twenty-eight years of service she retired from ARA Food Service. She served God and her Church until her illness. Fraulien leaves to cherish
