As Willie's health began to decline, he stayed home a lot more and watched his old fashioned westerns. Willie shared almost thirty-five years with his beloved Harriet, until God needed a new Angel in His Kingdom. On Saturday, March 24, 2012, the gates opened for Willie to come home and leave his suffering behind.
