March 31, 1915 - August 15, 2006

Willie Mae, the third of three children of the late Hattie and William Lawrence, was born in Chadbourn, North Carolina on March 31, 1915, and after an extended illness, departed this life on Tuesday, August 15, 2006 at the Sandtown-Winchester Nursing Home. Early on, the family moved to Rocky Mount, North Carolina where she received her early education. As a teenager she found her calling to God and joined the Ebenezer Baptist Church, where later she met Robert Perry, and whom she married in 1934. In 1939, they relocated to Baltimore, and soon after, with a strong desire to continue worshipping God, joined Macedonia Baptist Church. After membership there, she became an active member of the Usher Board, the Missionary Circle and the Kay Burke Choir, and continued her involvement until her health overcame her. In addition to her church activities, she and some friends organized a club called the "Secret Royal Ten Savings and Travel Club" that sponsored trips to Canada, Florida, Hawaii and California. During World War II, she found employment at Fort Meade, Md. Following the war she enrolled in a tailoring program at the Carver Vocational School and participated in some training sessions at the Red Cross. Up until the last ten years, she was involved in domestic work, most of which she was able to put in practice the skills she developed as a caterer. Robert, her beloved husband, preceded her in death in 1973. Willie Mae leaves to cherish her memory: her devoted sister, Marie Carlisle; devoted niece, Olivia H.
