WILLIE MAE WASHINGTON was born on August 14, 1924 in Sumter, South Carolina. She was the fifteenth child of the late William and Mary Davis.

Willie Mae, affectionately known to many as “Meta” or “Aunt Meta”, received her formal education from the Sumter County Public Schools.

Willie Mae accepted the Lord as her Savior at an early age. She attended church with her parents at Mount Mariah Baptist Church in Clarendon County, SC.

On August 13, 1941, Willie Mae gave birth to her handsome son, Thomas Davis whom she loved very dearly. He preceded her in death.
