Willie Thomas Worsham, Sr. was born in Amelia County, VA to the late Frank and Viola Worsham on March 21, 1944. He received his education in Amelia County Public Schools and later used that knowledge to become the first Black Deputy Sheriff in Amelia.

Willie realized the need for God in his life at an early age and was baptized at Manassas Hill Baptist Church. After moving to Richmond, he joined RNZBC and has been a member for over 20 years. Since joining Zion, he has been a member of multiple choirs, Men's Club, Hospitality Committee, and Sunday Breakfast Ministry. He helped out in any other way that he could.

Willie was last employed by Hanken & Johann, where he enjoyed his job as a Racker. He loved spending time with family, cooking, watching football, and playing Dominos.

Willie was preceded in death by his parents, his toddler brother James Worsham, his sister Hattie Scott, and his cousin/best friend Ben Worsham.
