Wilson Mack Jr. was born on October 14, 1941 to Jessie Barnes Mack and the late Wilson Mack, Sr., in Marlboro County, South Carolina. He was baptized at Ebenezer Methodist Church and received Christ in his life at an early age. Mr. Wilson Mack Jr. attended Kollocks Elementary School in Marlboro County, South Carolina and later attended Fairmont Hill High School after moving to Baltimore, Maryland with his family. Mr. Mack worked at Gordon's Seafood Restaurant (East Baltimore) for a decade as a cook. He also worked as a Groundsman at the Hebrew Cemetery. Mr. Wilson Mack Jr. met Mess Ana Booker and they were married in Baltimore, Maryland. Wilson was also known as "Ghosie" and had a smile and a joke at almost every occasion. He could be spotted in the crowd among family members, making the rounds to speak and then sharing a joke, usually a joke about you. He remained respectful and loyal to his aunts and uncles and would be available to help everyone who asked. Ghosie could be seen at anytime and anywhere helping or assisting, walking someone to their car, to their home, painting, washing window, moving furniture and keeping them laughing all the while. He enjoyed fishing, loved television and was a private person. He did not speak ill of life, he lived life. Mr. Mack cherished his close relationship with his brother, Raymond Mack and enjoyed having his brother also as a friend. Wilson's extended family and friends included Daylene, Rose, Maxine, Barbara, Mattie, Celeste, Mickey, Mr. O'Dell and Mr. Bobby. Last year, Cousin Clyde Barnes, Jr., spoke with Cousin Wilson Mack Jr., and shared with him the importance of

getting his spiritual house in order. Wilson attended the First John Tabernacle Baptist Church with Clyde on several occasions, singing and giving praise.
