



## Wilson Markel Giles

January 10, 1927 - April 8, 2004

After an honorable discharge, he attended Hampton Institute in Virginia, and graduated with a degree in accounting. In 1951, Wilson accepted employment with the National Security agency (NSA), where he progressed throughout his career. He had one child, a daughter, Michelle Giles Banks. Later, he met and married Vivian Crutchfield. For years he invested in real estate, and enjoyed traveling abroad. During the early eighties he joined the Double Finesse Duplicate Bridge Club. He also held the office of treasurer for other Duplicate Bridge Clubs. Wilson remained active with the Bridge clubs until his health began failing with the ending of his marriage.
