XAVIER ALLEN MUNDELL, affectionately known as “Zaye”, son of Belinda O. Jennings and the late Ronald A. Mundell, Sr., was born October 15, 1991 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life suddenly on July 4, 2015 as a result of complications related to his disabilities.

He began his educational journey in the Baltimore City Public School System when he was 8 months old, attending the William S. Baer School. The Baer School serves children with multiple disabilities from all over Baltimore City. It was at this school when Xavier's family realized his ability to bring joy to others was not destined just for family. After graduating from The Baer School, he went on to attend Lois T. Murray Elementary School and Chimes School.

At the age of 10, Xavier was accepted into the Benedictine School for Exceptional Children located in Ridgely, MD. This residential school's mission is to assist individuals ages 5-21 with disabilities in becoming as independent as possible; to make wise use of leisure time; and live and work in a community setting.

At the Benedictine School, Xavier flourished. He captivated the hearts of many with his winning personality, often landing a photo shot in the school's

newsletters. Despite Xavier's disabilities and challenges, he accomplished much. He learned independence, vocational skills, how to swim, and how to assist others. Xavier was willing to help his peers that were more challenged than he was by pushing their wheelchairs. He attended his prom and had a good time. Xavier graduated from there in 2013.

After graduating from the Benedictine School, Xavier transitioned to the Langton Green residential program. He resided in Annapolis, MD at one of their homes for adults with disabilities. He continued his ministry to win the hearts of staff. Xavier was employed with Opportunity Builders, Inc., which provided vocational training and employment services for adults with developmental disabilities in an environment that promotes personal fulfillment, addresses individual needs and fosters independence. Although Xavier didn't particularly care for the assigned job, often earning paychecks which cost more to print, he took great joy in assisting staff in making deliveries to other facilities.

At an early age, Xavier was baptized at the Eastern United Methodist Church. He enjoyed attending church and fervently praising the Lord. Each Sunday when Reverend Constance Smith gave her sermon, she knew she could get an "Amen" out of Xavier if from no one else. She also introduces him to one of his favorite songs, "I Believe I Can Fly."

Xavier had a love for looking his best. He was a snappy dresser and took pride in his appearance – a trait nurtured by his mom and sister. He enjoyed visiting exotic places by car, plane or cruise ship, swaying to music, dancing, family gatherings, amusement park rides, eating, and shopping.

Xavier will be missed by so many. He had a way that was his very own to bring joy and happiness to all who knew him; it may have been his big smile or his infectious laugh. But if you really knew him, then you know it was God's love shining through him to reach you!

Xavier was preceded in death by his father, Ronald Mundell, Sr.; maternal grandparents, Charlie and Willie Mae Leggett, paternal grandparents, Vernal Mundell, Sr. and Elaine Cates; aunt, Latricia Mundell; uncle, Vernal Mundell, Jr.; and special father-figure, Paul Trusty.

He leaves to cherish his memory: mom, Belinda O. 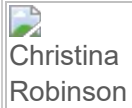
