Carol began her spiritual journey at a very young age at Saint Ann's Catholic Church where she made her first communion and confirmation. Later, she attended Saint Francis Xavier Roman Catholic Church. 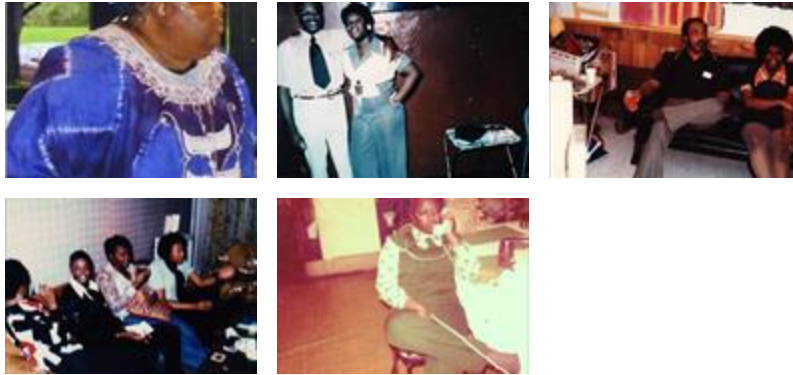
